Subject Specific Vocabulary

employment

To have employment means to have a job or other paid work.

paid job

An activity that is often regular and carried out in exchange for payment.

unpaid job

An activity that is often regular and not carried out in exchange for payment. Examples include volunteer, homemaker and student.

skill

The ability to do something well.

job application

A letter or form containing details of your qualifications, skills and experience that you send to a place where you want to work.

healthcare

Jobs that provide medical care. Examples include; doctors, nurses, dentists, psychiatrists and pharmacists.

finance

Jobs that involve managing and protecting money.

retail

Jobs that involve the selling of goods to the public, usually through shops.

education

Jobs that involve teaching, training and learning, especially in schools, colleges or universities.

urban

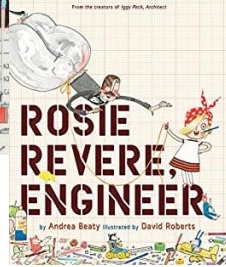
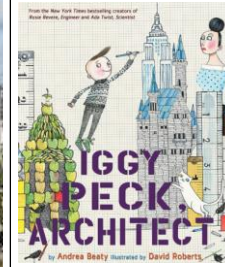
