

| elevation | The height to which something rises or is raised, or its height above sea level or ground level. | |
| drainage | The act of gradually becoming dry or empty. | |
| vegetation belt | The plant life of an area or plant community (collection of plant species). | FAIRTRADE |
| global | Relating to the whole world. | Sticky Knowledge |
| arable farming | Farms that produce crops (i.e. wheat or vegetable). | The food we consume is produced in different countries around the world. |
| pastoral farming | Farms where animals are raised for meat, wool or dairy products. | Climate is important in the production of plant-based food. |
| mixed farming | A combination farm which grows crops as well as keep animals. | Food frequently travels long distances from the producer to our plates and often goes through many people (intermediaries); all of whom take a share of the final profit. |
| supply chain | A network of people and activities that help move a product from start to consumption by the end user. | Farmers and producers at the start of the supply chain, receive a small proportion of the value of the food they produce and often |
| consumer | A person who buys goods or services for their own use. | cannot make a decent living. |
| Fairtrade | A way of buying and selling products that allows the farmers to be paid a fair price for their produce, and have better working conditions | A significant proportion of the global food supply is produced by small-scale farmers. |
| famine | Exists when large numbers of people cannot get enough food for long periods of time. | Although small-scale farmers face many challenges, they are incredibly productive and we need them. |
| malnutrition | A serious condition that happens when your diet does not contain the right amount of nutrients. | There is plenty of food available across the world but many people are unable to access that food owing to a lack of resources. |
| sustainability | The idea that humans must interact with the environment in a way that ensures there will be enough resources left for future generations. | There are many different reasons why people don't have enough food. Some reasons are due to; climate change, war, poverty, rising food prices and loss of farmland. |
