American state	A state is a self-governing entity that has control over a geographic area (territory). The U.S. is a country of 50 states covering a vast swathe of North America.
Central America	A narrow strip of land that lies at the southern end of North America. It connects that continent with South America.
Tropic of Cancer	The most northerly circle of latitude on Earth at which the Sun can be directly overhead.
Arctic Circle	A parallel latitude that runs north of the equator. The North Pole is in the centre of the Arctic Circle.
Panama Canal	A waterway that connects the Atlantic and Pacific ocean.
Rocky Mountains	A large mountain range in the US and Canada.
Mojave Desert	A dry region of the southwestern United States that lies mostly in California.
Great Plains	A broad expanse of flatland in North America that is located west of the Mississippi River and east of the Rocky Mountains.
Grand Canyon	A canyon is a narrow, deep valley cut by a river through rock. The Grand Canyon is a famous canyon in Arizona, formed by the Colorado River
arid land	Arid land is so dry that very few plants can grow on it.
the Everglades	A natural region of tropical wetlands in Florida.
mangrove	A tree with roots which are above the ground and that grows along coasts or on the banks of large rivers in hot countries.




- There are 23 countries in **North America**, with **Canada** being the biggest.
